## Year 11 Student Expectations

Students will be unable to make an informed decision on this matter until results day : Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> August.

No student will be disadvantaged if they are unable to complete work in terms of their Centre Assessment Grades.

All work set is aimed to support the transition and bridge the gap between Year 11and any Post-16 study, ultimately this will benefit students in the courses/training that they begin in September. Students should feel no pressure to complete this work and it is only set to allow them to advance themselves and with their best interests in mind.
