
## Alderbrook School

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Dear Parents/Carers

I'd like to congratulate all Year 10 and 12 students who have attended school this week. Their behaviour has been exemplary and they have shown an excellent attitude to learning. Across the week, we have had over 70% of Year 10 in school and 90% of Year 12. A number of teachers have been to see me to comment on how impressed they have been, well done all!

For all students, remote learning remains the main platform for schooling. We have asked teachers to create more personalised and interactive lessons where they can, and teachers will ask students to submit key pieces of work either on quiz style platforms, or via email or Class Charts.

From later today, you will find on our school website an overview of the work that has been set virtually during lockdown, including topics reviewed and new knowledge taught, identifying the work that needs to be submitted to teachers. This work will be important for students to try to complete, and it will help us to evaluate the curriculum for September.
