Curriculum News...

Happy New Year to all our students, families and staff! We welcome back Year 12 and 13 students to a busy and important half-term of study and activities. This Wednesday we 'fold down' enrichment for students and are focusing on Personal and Social Education, learning more about the plight of refugees on our doorstep here in Birmingham. Year 12 will participate in workshops with volunteers from St Chad's Sanctuary in period 4, whilst Year 13s who are not in an exam will revise in supervised silent study. Period 5 we will all come to together to hear an informative talk led by some of our Year 13 students who visited the sanctuary in December, alongside other guest speakers. Chosen enrichment activities will begin again on Wednesday 15 January – please can all students make sure they have selected their preferred choices online asap.

Congratulations to the overwhelming majority of Year 13 students who decided to go down the UCAS route, most of whom are either busy receiving dates of interviews or offers. We are also very pleased to see and hear the remaining Year 13 students being proactive as they begin to secure competitive apprenticeships within the West Midlands. We wish them all luck whatever their chosen destination. For Year 12, it is never too early to start thinking about life after Sixth Form and planning meaningful Work Experience should be top of the agenda right now! Students will receive a letter this month detailing what they must do now in order to arrange and confirm with us their work experience placement for June 2020. If any student is struggling to attain a placement, Mrs Friend has a small directory of contacts that can be approached.

As we enter what can be quite a stressful time for students, please be assured that the Sixth Form Tutors, Mrs Hess (Learning & Wellbeing Manager), Mr Bryan (Head of Year 12), Mrs Howard (Assistant Director & Head of Year 13) and myself, are always here if your child has any concerns with any particular subject or has any issues or uncertainties. All they need to do is to come and talk to us. Our students' personal development and success is as important to us, as it is to you.

Getting to grips with student finance!

With Year 13 UCAS applications complete and offers rolling in, it is time to focus on the next stage of university preparation – finance. The process can seem daunting for students and parent/carers but there is nothing to fear! You will no doubt find the following pointers useful:

- Know your loans: With a tuition loan, you can borrow enough to cover the full cost of your fees and it is paid directly to the institution where you study. The amount you can get for tuition fee loans doesn't depend on your household income (up to £9,250). A maintenance loan helps with your living costs such as rent, food and books. The amount you can borrow depends on your circumstances but, if you are moving away from home (but not to London), you could be eligible for up to £8,700. To find out how much you may be eligible for go to www.gov.uk/student-finance-calculator
- Apply early: Get your application completed as soon as possible to ensure your money arrives on time. Don't worry if you have not accepted a place yet – you can update your details later. To find out more visit <u>www.ucas.com/money</u>
- 3. **Stay safe:** Remember the Student Loans Company will never ask you to confirm bank details or login information via email.
- 4. **Consent to share:** Tick the box to allow universities to view your details. Care leavers and those from low-income households may be entitled to extra funding and can be assessed more quickly.

5. **Seek out extra support:** Find out if you are eligible for an additional bursary or scholarship by contacting your university or college.

But perhaps the biggest victor was the engagement of young people in politics, who frequently turn out to vote in far fewer numbers than our older counterparts. Hopefully thanks to our initiative, we've helped to reverse that trend in a small way.

ENRICHMENT

Enterprise – Students have been working in their enterprise groups to develop their business proposal. We have the following teams: Plantology, CERS Candies. OurFaces and H1RELEARNING.

- Plantology aim to produce and sell hand decorated succulent plant pots.
- CERS Candies plan to produce confectionary; sweets and chocolates.
- OurFaces aim to produce quality 100% cotton t-shirts with a design that fits with the style of today.
- H1RELEARNING are a company devoted to helping students enhance their education through private tuition in a variety of subjects.

The groups spent the Autumn term thinking about various options and developing their ideas. Once they had finalised their idea, in order to enter the Tycoon Enterprise Challenge (set up by Peter Jones), they have been working on their business plans. Groups will submit their plans before their February deadline, to secure funding to set up their businesses. The businesses will then trade between 24 February 2020 and 27 March 2020. At the end of the trading window they will evaluate their business and we will wait to see if they have done enough to win the competition and the chance to be invited to a prestigious celebration event at Buckingham Palace!

Creative Writing – We have had a fantastic first ever term of Creative Writing! Each week we have enjoyed quick-write activities using a range of interesting stimuli and creative prompts. In October we started drafting our own poems to be entered into the esteemed Tower Poetry Competition (this year the idea title given is 'Trees') and in November we welcomed Derek Littlewood from Birmingham City University to run a workshop with students looking at both poetic form and 'getting into a short story'. We have truly enjoyed working together and sharing our passion for writing.

Duke of Edinburgh – This year our cohort has increased to eighteen Year 12 students, who have been busy completing the skill, physical and volunteering sections of the award. We have a range of activities going on from Skateboarding to Swimming. When we return in the New Year, we will begin preparation for the expedition this summer, with some keys dates for the diary:

This was a good experience for the younger students who benefited from reading and practising spellings with enthusiastic, positive role models. Aaliyah is also working on resources for Dyslexic students, which we are very much looking forward to sharing with the students when they are completed in the New Year.

This year, we are pleased to introduce a new essay prize in Mathematics. Each of the Newnham Essay Prizes has a first prize of £400, a second prize of £200 and a third prize of £100. There will be a prize-giving at Newnham College in June 2020. Entries are welcome from interested students studying any combination of subjects. Each competition has a slightly different word limit, so please consult the questions and information sheet for each of the prizes. All essays must reference sources (including websites consulted) and provide a bibliography. Students may only submit an essay for one subject. Each school may only submit 5 entries per subject.
