



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The Sixth Form Curriculum

Programme of Study

The Programme of Study refers to the academic subjects a student will choose alongside independent study, enrichment and work experience. At Alderbrook you can have a choice of what this will be:

- 3 A Level Subjects (standard entry)
- 3 A Level Subjects + AS Core Maths
- 3 A Level Subjects + an EPQ
- 4 A Level Subjects (at least six 9-8 GCSEs)

We are proud to offer a broad and varied A Level curriculum. We hope you will be able to select courses that suit your skills and talents – ask your current teachers, and Sixth Form students who you know, more about the A Levels you are interested in.

You will be encouraged to study with ambition and enthusiasm. Sixth Form classes are smaller, attention is individual and lessons increasingly become like university seminars, taught by passionate subject specialists. Whilst maintaining a supportive structure of monitoring and guidance, we gradually devolve greater responsibility for learning to our students in order to equip them with the right skills and disciplines sought by leading universities.

Students also have the option to take the rigorous, research-based Extended Project Qualification, which is highly prized by universities since it demands a degree of independence and intellectual maturity beyond traditional A Levels.

Some courses and careers require A Levels in specific subjects, but for many students the chances are that you may not find a career directly related to your studies at A Level or Degree.

Entry Requirements

- Candidates should normally be sixteen years of age, but not yet seventeen on 1 September.
- Five 9-5 GCSEs will be required including English and Mathematics.
- Grade 6 will generally be required in the chosen subjects where it has been studied at Key Stage 4.
 However, you should refer to the subject specific information to confirm this, as individual subjects may be higher and other GCSE qualifications may be required or desirable. You can find this on our website.
- A commitment to learning evidenced from school reports.

If you do not achieve the grades you expected or had hoped for, it will be important to seek advice from our enrolment team on GCSE Results Day. In some circumstances, and dependent on your choices of A Level subjects exceptions may be made, however it should be noted that this is very rare. All courses will be offered as full two year Linear A Level qualifications.



The Whole Person: The Whole Point

Our Enrichment Programme underpins our Sixth Form. Whilst the emphasis in Years 12 and 13 is on academic studies, students will be preparing to enter a competitive world either through further study, training or employment. It is important that students have an opportunity to build their CV, develop their personal interests and broaden their wider skill base.

Alderbrook Sixth Form offers a wealth of opportunities for students to get involved in, from team sports to Arts qualifications, from mentoring our younger students to volunteering in the local community. An exciting range of enrichment activities is offered to all Sixth Form students every term, with the chance to add to your UCAS points, gain relevant life skills and work experience. Wednesday afternoons are non-contact time and are set aside for students to undertake enrichment. It is an ideal opportunity to make new friends and try something new. Some of these opportunities are available because we are an 11–18 school, and we pride ourselves on the vast range of experiences our staff are able to offer Sixth Form students.

Through our enrichment programme we are also able to support our aspiring Higher Education 'early applicants' through the Medics Society and Oxbridge mentoring. The MedSoc is run by Year 13 students who have committed to applying that year for Medicine or Dentistry. A range of health professionals visit regularly and host masterclasses for the society. Potential Oxbridge students are taken to both Oxford and Cambridge during Year 12. We enjoy meeting Alumni students who are proud to host us in their various Colleges. Alderbrook staff who attended Oxbridge themselves, also serve as mentors using enrichment time for focused discussion, application and interview preparations.

Shaping Your Future

Students can be assured that they will receive expert support and guidance in helping to choose either a career, or a Higher Education institute for further study. Students will receive independent and impartial guidance from Year 12 onwards, which will be delivered through workshops and at least two individual 1:1 meetings with our full time Careers Co-ordinator.

Careers events and university visits will form part of Sixth Form life and students will have opportunities for high quality and relevant work experience placements in the summer term of Year 12. We have forged good working relationships with leading universities which enable our Sixth Form students to access advice for their future higher education. Students are allocated a personal tutor, who will guide them through the UCAS application process and how to complete the personal statement. If an apprenticeship or employment route is of more interest to you however, Alderbrook has strong links with local businesses and organisations, through our 'Life Ready' Programme so there will be equal support for these pathways too.

Alderbrook invest in an award winning ICT platform called 'Unifrog', which parents and students have found an excellent resource. The programme, which can be accessed anywhere, provides additional support in researching and selecting Post 18 courses and live apprenticeship opportunities.

Once a fortnight students benefit from the 'Power Hour' Lecture series – a collection of future pathway explorations delivered by either highly successful individuals or leading University faculties. Notable guests to date include, Alexander Campbell, Principal Dancer of the Royal Ballet; Neal Coupland of Wasps RFC; Phil Neale of Britain's Got Talent fame; Clare Connor OBE, Director of England Women's Cricket and Graham Short, famed micro-artist. These personalities are counterbalanced with lectures by Birmingham University's College of Medicine and Dentistry and the University of Warwick's Law School.

At Alderbrook our 'Life Ready' Programme also contributes significantly to preparing Sixth Form students for life beyond A Levels and education. For three days per year the curriculum is folded and students partake in a range of activities tailored to their needs. In Year 12 these days have included: Certified St John's Ambulance First Aid courses, Political Engagement, University Open Day visits and workshops. In Year 13 the focus shifts to interview technique, so that students are empowered to perform well under pressure. Motivation and goal setting in preparation for exams are also covered, as well as 'Next Step Survival' – a day of budgeting, basic cooking skills and personal safety.

Our Sixth Form team will continue to be available to support students in the practical steps after they have received their A Level results.

Careers education, information and guidance are strong. In 2017, all students went on to higher education, employment or training. Students value the high-quality and independent advice they receive as well as appropriate work experience.

Student Life

Alderbrook has a strong community feel and no less so in our Sixth Form. The current Year 12 and 13 students are excellent role models for the rest of the school, although we recognise the need for them to maintain an independence from other year groups. Students in the Sixth Form benefit from having excellent contemporary and attractive facilities, including their own social space and bistro; a silent study, discussion room and large ICT suite for independent learning, as well as the exclusive use of their own outside facilities.

Sixth Form students enjoy a separate wellbeing support system, tutor time and communal meetings appropriate to their needs. Each student is also assigned their own tutor with whom they will forge a strong working relationship over the two years. The Heads of Year, alongside our Sixth Form Learning and Wellbeing Manager, oversee all aspects of student care. In essence, there is always someone to listen to and support students, and for parents too, there is always someone available.

Student Voice and Leadership is an integral part of our Post 16 community. We want to build excellent relationships with our young adults and we encourage them to be proactive in their learning and experiences with us. As such, we give students a variety of ways to voice their opinions and invoke change: Senior Leadership Roles, Student Committee, Subject Ambassadors, and Conferences. Highlights for students are often our lively social events including charity dress-ups, cultural trips – both home and abroad – annual Christmas Dinner and Quiz, Prize Giving, Leavers' Picnic, all culminating in the Grand Summer Ball.

Alderbrook Sixth Form employs a dress code, based on smart business attire. Full details of the Dress Code can be found in the Sixth Form area of the school website. Financial help is available at Alderbrook through the 16-19 Bursary. This fund exists to provide support to learners who are facing financial difficulty, which may otherwise mean that they would be prevented from, or struggle to, participate fully in education and training.

Life in the Sixth Form at Alderbrook is energetic; full of opportunities and challenge. Whatever your future goals and career aspirations we can help you on your road to success!
