Sixth Form Medics Society Autumn Term 2020



The Sixth Form runs a lively and varied programme of enrichment options, and this term the Medics Society, 26 students keen to work in healthcare roles such as GP, pharmacist, paramedic, dentist and physiotherapist, have been fortunate to be visited "virtually" by a wide range of online speakers, many of whom are parent contacts.

Dr Clift, a top cardiologist from the Birmingham Centre for Rare Diseases, advised the students

about getting into medicine and gave us a frank insight into his work and career.

Senior Audiologist Mrs Joanne Davis explained about audiology and answered questions about what can impair hearing (NB the repeated use of headphones attached to a phone can be very damaging!).

Six doctors from Warwick Hospital also gave a talk on what it is like to be a student doctor and have run a series of mock interviews for our prospective medics via MS Teams, to prepare them for the forthcoming processes.

We have completed First Aid training based on the St John Ambulance and First Aid for Free online resources, undertook the Zero Suicide Alliance training to help someone in a crisis, follow the social media of our favourite "Medicelebs" and have studied current news events around Covid to understand the trials, vaccine, political controversies, socio-economic issues and logistics of this unfolding story.



We have befriended the elderly members of the Wednesday Club and now maintain penpal contact with them to offer support and company.

Finally, after hearing the story from one of our own school staff whose son was treated at Heartlands Hospital, the group decided to make a video to promote the hospital's fundraising effort and the Sixth Form Christmas Jumper day collection will be donated to this worthy cause.
