
# Alderbrook School

Kate, working most recently as Deputy Headteacher, has fulfilled a whole host of roles in her time at Alderbrook. Kate is part of the fabric of Alderbrook and has seen so many changes both nationally and locally through her school career with us, but has always been the first to respond and lead, whilst always having the children that come here at the very forefront of all that she does.
