GCSE Drama:

- There are two practical exams in year 11.
- Practical exam 1- Devised original theatre. Internally marks, externally moderated. Student produce and create an original piece of theatre lasting about 15 minutes. Due to be performed in early November. Exact dates to be confirmed. (40% of GCSE)
- Practical exam 2- Scripted performance. Externally marked by AQA examiners.
 Students produce 1 scripted performance from a published play. Due to be performed in late march. Exact dates to be confirmed. (20% of GCSE)
- There is a written exam in June 2022

Key Messages for BTEC:

- Component 2 performances in early December. C2 is a scripted performance exam. (30% of the diploma).
- Component 3- performances in early April. Exact dates to be confirmed. C3 is a devised performance based on a brief sent to school from BTEC. (40% of the Diploma).
- There is no final written exam, but students write written coursework for component 2 and 3.









Modern Foreign Languages AQA GCSE French/Spanish:

- Speaking and Writing: all answers for the given themes should be developed and learnt. Students should book individual appointments with their teachers, so they practise all elements of the exam. All preparation for the speaking will also inform the writing exam.
- Reading and Listening: students should complete all allocated activities from the GCSEpod and deepen their language knowledge by revising the key structures and vocabulary from Quizlet.



Art Department:

- We are still unsure if there will be an Art or Photography Exam and that the course will have a coursework deadline at Christmas. Until we have clarification from JCQ and OCR our exam board the deadline is still fixed for before Christmas.
- Coursework is 60% of the final mark so meeting deadlines and working consistently this next 10 weeks is very important

BTEC Music:

- Students will be completing the Unit 1- The Music Industry exam on <u>Thursday 13th January 2022.</u>
- Currently, students are studying for Unit 3 Live Sound where students are being asked to be the 'sound engineer' for a performance. Students must also prepare a piece of music as part of a group to perform. Therefore students should be rehearsing a piece of music as well as ensuring their coursework for Unit 3 is being handed in on time.
- To complete the course, after the exam in January, students will complete a final unit called Unit 2 - Music Product, where the class will work as a team to deliver a music product such as a concert, podcast or an album. Details of this will be finalised closer to the time.

Health & Social Care:

 Reminder – Health & Social Care and ICT students have external exams in January and they should be using the resources on Microsoft Teams to support their preparation.



Business/Computing:

 For Business and Computing all support material will be on their Teams pages


What will my programme of study be?
