

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Dear Parents/Carers 7 October 2021

We are already over half way through our first Autumn half term and the students have settled in really well and are working hard.

Covid 19 update

We have seen a slight rise in positive Covid cases over the last week with 9 cases across the school community, 5 of which are in Year 8. This is a reminder that vigilance is key and that by continuing to ask your child to take lateral flow tests on Wednesday and Sunday evenings, you are helping to prevent the further spread of the virus. If your child's lateral flow test is positive, you then need to book a PCR test. Please be aware that if your child is symptomatic, they should not do a lateral flow test. Instead, a PCR test needs to be booked as soon as possible. If cases continue to rise we will seek further advice from the Public Health Team and introduce additional measures where necessary.

Pupils should remain at home and not come into school if:

- They are displaying symptoms (these include a high temperature, cough, loss of taste and/or smell, sore throat, headache, runny nose and sneezing)
- They have tested positive on a lateral flow test
- They are awaiting a PCR test result having shown symptoms
- They have tested positive on a PCR test

Covid case procedure

The government has removed the requirement to wear face coverings in classrooms and communal areas, although staff and pupils can still choose to do so. It is advised that face coverings should still be worn on school buses and public transport.
