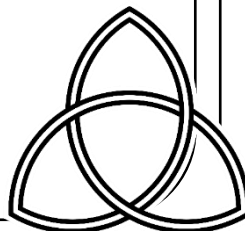

Incarnation means 'embodiment'. Christians believe that Jesus was both fully divine (the pre-existent Word of God) and fully human (conceived by and born of Mary). The idea of the incarnation is difficult to understand, similar to the Trinity. It aims to show how early Christians and the disciples expressed their belief in Jesus

Why is the incarnation important to Christians?

The crucifixion of Jesus is the story of when Jesus was put on the cross to die by the Romans. He was crucified because he was claiming to be the Messiah, which at the time was blasphemous. Jesus' death was needed to atone for the sins of humanity. He sacrificed himself to give Christians/people a chance to be forgiven for the sins they have committed.
