Surahs 81 and 82 describe what will happen when Akhirah (the end of the world) comes. The Angel Israfil will sound the trumpet, there will be blinding light and the sky will be cut. The Earth will be destroyed, with mountains becoming dust and oceans boiling over with fire. The Earth will be transformed and the dead raised up. The living will die instantly.

How does the belief in Akhirah affect how Muslims live their life?



Al-Qadr means that everything happens as a result of Allah's *will* and nothing is ever random or without reason. It means predestination of the will of Allah; that Allah is *in charge* of everything in life and has a purpose for everything as part of his plan. Humans control themselves (emotions, choices, responses) but can't control everything (weather etc). They have free will but God knows a person's choices.
