

XELLO – Introduction to parents

This year we have introduced a new student careers platform called XELLO. This was launched with students for the first time in December and many of our students logged in and completed the skills audit and discovered relevant linked careers. Students can access XELLO the following ways:

- Via the school email account and search for XELLO in the Apps section (9 dots in top left of the screen).
- Via the website https://login.xello.co.uk/ using the following details:
 - Username school email address
 - Password date of birth (ddmmyyyy)

Using XELLO, students can complete personal skills and interest audits to discover and save potential careers of interest. They can also search and discover details on both careers and higher education institutions.


Securing an Apprenticeship – A Student's Experience (Year 13)

Owen Hawksley, one of our year 13 students who has successfully secured an apprenticeship with Grant Thornton UK, has answered some of the most frequently asked questions about apprenticeships.

Why an apprenticeship?

For me, I knew that only going to university was not what I wanted to do next and that I wanted to go straight into the world of work and to start gaining invaluable experience as soon as I could. Yet, a qualification at the end of an apprenticeship could also be incredibly useful, especially for securing the more high-end jobs. Because of this, I decided doing an apprenticeship alongside studying for a qualification is what was best suited for me.

How did you search for vacancies?





A lot of it was simply searching 'apprenticeship' online and clicking on the company websites which came up. UCAS careers finder was also how I found some vacancies.

What was the application process like, including interviews?

The majority of the apprenticeships I applied for did not actually require a CV, choosing to opt for online assessments instead. These online assessments give you workplace scenarios and some of the most frequent tasks was ranking what you would be likely to do in a certain situation. Some of them also had numerical and personality games to complete as well. If you pass the assessment, then there is usually another intermediary stage before the final interview. In my case, I had to complete a digital interview, which consisted of me having to record myself answering given questions, as well as a written case study. If this is successful, then it is onto the final stage: the interview/experience day. Some placements are offering in-person experience days at the moment, but a lot of them will be online. My experience day was online and was split into two parts: a group exercise and the final interview. Many of the companies offering apprenticeships will have careers pages, offering advice and guidance on how to do well in your application process and interview(s).

What qualification will you achieve?

I will be studying for a Level 7 ACA qualification, which is equivalent to a master's degree. any tips for those who are considering similar routes

Any tips for those considering similar routes?

My main tip is to not let rejection get you down. Whilst I secured a placement at one company, I must've gotten rejected from about 7 others, quite a few of which I was rejected after the first stage! Do your research and use the resources that are available to you. Explanations of the application processes for a company are often listed on their website, along with tips and tricks to help you along the way. Make sure to also look at a company's values and look at their place and purpose in the industry, if you can put these into your interview questions then it should be sure to impress!


It also helps you know whether a company will be the right fit for you or not. And for the final interview/experience day, as cliche as it seems, try your best to be yourself. Most if not all of the candidates applying for your role will be nervous, but if you relax and let your personality shine through, it'll definitely help make you stand out. Many of the companies tend to do more conversational interviews regardless, so this gives you the opportunity to show who you are.

'Where to start when thinking about careers', CIPD Enterprise Advisor, Anne Ranahan

I went to LightHall School in Shirley and I can remember the build-up to results days which felt like a challenging time. Students are faced with difficult and scary decisions about their next steps. Many students need guidance with their thinking and sometimes have to change their plans.

There is a lot to consider when making a career decision and lots for you to research. I would suggest you start early so you have time to explore what really interests you.

Where do you want to get to? What is important to you? Where can you find out about your options? Do you want to study full time; work full time or a combination of both?





There are a range of further learning options available to you from apprenticeships to A Levels and also the new T Level qualifications. Do you need to find out more about each of these different pathways?

Parents/carers can help you in your decision-making process but remember their experience of work/learning may differ from your experience. Listen to their opinion alongside investigating what a job type looks like today. Find out about the job roles that are in demand and likely to be needed in the future.

I am aware you will have individual time with your Careers Co-ordinator, Esta Leawal. Go prepared for this interview and make the most use of this time for you. You also have the ABK Careers web pages on your website, are you aware of the resources that are available to you?

As someone who has recruited many students to a range of different occupational areas, I would recommend it is effective to research a number of different career pathways and find out what you need to gain in terms of qualifications and skills to perform the roles that interest you. What do you need to put in place to have a good chance of securing a place at a chosen college/university? What skills and qualifications do you need to be successful in securing a job interview for a chosen role?

Always research jobs that you know you will enjoy. Research may mean completing voluntary work/part time work or observing someone doing the job. Collect useful experiences while you are at school that will make you stand out from the crowd. The job market is competitive. Your CV/application form will be strengthened by positions of responsibility e.g. Team Captain, completing the Duke of Edinburgh Award...

Rather than feeling scared about your career choices, enjoy your careers preparation. Have a plan, do a little often, record what you have done and found out and feel in control of your journey.


