

Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a pleasure to welcome in the lighter mornings and evenings and we are looking forward to warmer weather and more outdoor activities in the months ahead. Another term has gone by very quickly and so much has been achieved. A highlight for me was watching the Spring Concert on Tuesday; the students performing were fantastic.

I hope that you all have a very relaxing and happy Easter break. We hope that all students going to Iceland and Spain over the break with the Geography and MFL departments have an amazing experience. We also wish the best of luck to the students in our Drama department who as part of the National Theatre's Connections programme will be performing a play called 'Strangers like me' at the Royal and Derngate Theatre. This follows months of rehearsals and preparation and two very successful performances in school. It is wonderful to have so many students involved in these events and all of the other wide ranging activities and experiences that are offered to enrich their curriculum and interests.

Uniform

With the Summer Term fast approaching, please can I take this opportunity to ask you to reinforce the standards of uniform that are expected at Alderbrook School. Staff will consistently check uniform at specified points of the school day in the new term, with the primary focus being on the following:

Blazers

The Alderbrook blazer is an essential part of our school ethos and culture. Simply, blazers must be worn and brought to school every day, regardless of the weather. Those students who arrive at school without their blazer will be provided with one which they will wear for the day. As has always been the case, hoodie style jumpers, should not be worn and will be confiscated. They are certainly not a replacement for the blazer in any circumstance.

Shoes

We do appreciate that shoes can be an expensive item for parents/carers to buy and recognise the speed with which some students grow out of shoes. Equally, it is not appropriate in April for students to wear inappropriate footwear because they usually get new shoes in September. Essentially, students should not wear trainers to school of any colour or design. Only students who have a medical note are permitted to wear trainers in school. This is a message that is reinforced continually by staff. Should students have PE on any particular day, they will only wear trainers for this lesson. Students who wear trainers to school will be directed to change into shoes provided by the school and their trainers will be returned at the end of the day. This will be the case for every student, including those with a note from parents/carers.

Ties

Ties must be worn, again, regardless of the weather. Lost ties should be replaced in the first instance on ParentPay, and collected from the Admin Office in school. Please name school ties clearly.



Staff will be checking students' uniform upon arrival at school each day and then again at beginning of period one. Each student then has the opportunity to ensure the rest of their day can be a positive experience, focused purely on their learning.

Examination Season

There are a number of examinations taking place after Easter. On Monday 17th April, Year 10 begin their assessments in each subject and we wish the students the best of luck. Also during the first week back, Year 11 will be sitting their speaking examinations in French and Spanish so good luck to those students involved. May sees the start of the formal examination season for Year 11 and Year 13 and we know how hard the students are working to prepare for these final assessments.
