Messages from the Police

The police have asked us to share with you the attached letter about knife crime. Thankfully knife crime is very low in our area but we ask you to read this advice and talk to your children about it. Please read the letter here.

As the nights get longer and we enter the winter period, the police have also asked us to share the messages below as they see an increase in burglary and vehicle time at this time of year. We will also be speaking to the students about how they can stay safe, particularly after dark.

Burglary – invest in timer switches for lights so that they come on when you are out of the house. Invest in home security – ring door bells, cctv, good locks etc. Anything that will make your home unappealing to burglars. Also, be very careful what you post on social media as burglars can use the information to understand when your home will be unoccupied. Similarly, apps like 'track my run' advertise your routines and people can find out where you'll be vulnerable at certain times.

Vehicle crime – many vehicles are stolen via keyless devices which jam signals and allow vehicles to be stolen without keys. A lot of vehicles are being stolen from retail park and supermarket car parks because people walk away from their vehicles and use a fob to lock it. The criminal will then use their device to jam the signal and stop the vehicle being locked. Always physically check the door handle to ensure you have locked your car. A top tip would be, whether your car is parked at home or elsewhere, invest in an old fashioned steering lock, which will make the vehicle much harder to steal and thus not an attractive target. Another great investment are good quality trackers. Finally, never be tempted to leave your engine running to defrost a car whilst you wait in the house. A lot of cars are stolen because of this.
